## DEFENSIVE PISTOL SHOOT RESULTS

(July 24, 2004–El Dorado Rod and Gun Club) John L. Lustig: Match Director/Range Safety Officer

This is a COLD range. No loaded firearms allowed except as directed by the Range Safety Office. The ONLY time that the firearm is to be handled is at the 'Safe Table' or under the Safety Officer's direction. No ammunition is to be handled at the 'Safe Table'. You should arrive at the range with two bags. One bag to contain your unloaded firearm, holster, magazine pouches and any other support equipment. The other bag to contain your ammunition.

IDPA (International Defensive Pistol Association) [www.idpa.com](http://www.idpa.com) rules are used as guidelines for the Courses of Fire. The Courses of Fire are typically 18 rounds or less. They are typically (but not always) revolver (six shot) friendly and concealed carry unless otherwise specified. Shooting (engaging targets) is done from in the open, behind cover and on the move. Shooting through openings and from behind barricades / cover is done from both right and left sides. Strong hand only and support (weak) hand only shooting is utilized.

IDPA paper targets and hostage (no shoot targets) utilized can be positioned stationary: Also utilized are reactive (moving, suddenly appearing or disappearing) targets. Metal knock down (Pepper Poppers) targets, stationary metal disks on stands and knock off round metal disks are also used.

### STAGE #1: DEA COMBAT COURSE #16 (MODIFIED) CAN YOU WALK AND CHEW GUM AT THE SAME TIME?

**SCENARIO:** You just stepped in pail of something and some bad guys behind you are laughing at you, something about the fact that you are so uncoordinated that you can't walk

and chew gum at the same time. Unfortunately you dropped your gum in whatever you stepped in so you will have to walk and shoot at the same time.

**START:** At audible sound, take your foot out of the drum, turn and then draw; while moving forward engage targets T-1 through T-6 in any order with one round each minimum while moving from position P1 to Position P2. Perform a TACTICAL RELOAD! While moving backwards from position P2 to P1 engage targets T1 through T-6 in any order with one round minimum. ALL SHOTS MUST BE MADE WHILE MOVING!!! Careful not to hit the hostages. NOTE: NO shoot identifiers will move.

### STAGE #2: WHO CAME FROM WHERE?

**SCENARIO:** You are minding your own business enjoying the sunny day when from behind a wall you hear someone shouting obscenities at you and that they are coming to get you. You recognize two of the bad guys voices from a news bulletin as the 'jump out, flip you off and the shoot guy' and the other one is 'bobble head' that jumps out from cover and then back behind cover.

**START:** Facing up range at audible sound turn and then draw, from either side of the walls engage the bad guys in tactical priority, shooters option which side to engage first; after the shooter has engaged the visible targets they will pull the rope to engage the reactive target. Reload as necessary per IDPA requirements.

### STAGE #3: BOXED OUT

**SCENARIO:** You are a narcotics agent inspecting some conex boxes for contraband and are backed into the storage facility behind some of the suspect containers. You hear people coming towards the area that you are hiding. You turn around and realize that the people are the suspected smugglers and have taken your teammates as hostages.

**START:** At audible sound, turn and then draw and engage the three bad guys in front of you in tactical sequence or tactical priority, shooters option; Move the right or left and engage the next three bad guys in tactical priority; move the other side and engage the bad guys in tactical priority. Careful not to hit the hostages. Reload as necessary per IDPA requirements.

### STAGE #4: BAD DAY AT THE EDR&G MOUNTAIN RETREAT

**SCENARIO:** You are taking a much-needed retreat and enjoying the wooded mountains area. Unbeknown to you a bunch of 'tweekers' have taken a couple of locals as hostages and are roaming the woods for cabins to break into to steal stuff to sell to get more drugs. You are awakened by the voices behind you. You react by taking cover behind a tree stump and using other trees as cover and engage the bad guys before the get you.

**START:** At the mountain retreat sitting in chair facing up range reading magazine with loaded pistol on table beside you (facing down range), your choice of side. At audible sound, get up from chair, retrieve pistol and from behind cover of a stump and two trees engage the bad guys. If shooting from behind and over the middle drum bad guys must be engaged in tactical sequence. If engaging bad guys from either side of the drums the bad guys must be engaged in tactical priority. If the engagement is done in tactical priority the shooters option to start from the left or the right side and then move to the other side. ALL movement must be done from behind cover!!! Careful not to hit the hostages. Reload as necessary per IDPA requirements.

### STAGE #5: SPRAY AND PRAY (spray them with the shotgun, pray that you hit them)

You are a local landowner up on the divide watching some marijuana growers set an irrigation system for the plants that they have just planted on your property. Daydreaming / not paying attention to what is going on around you some bad guys and their dogs sneak you behind you. From the bushes behind you you hear one of the bad guys yell at the dog; sick him! The bad guys are armed with machetes and have taken hostages. The dogs are running towards you.

**START:** At audible sound turn, pick up shotgun and engage steel targets (simulated dogs) in tactical priority from both sides of cover. When shotgun is empty place it with action open on drum with carpet. Any steel targets not knocked

down with the shotgun may be renege with pistol. Engage paper bag guys in tactical priority. Shooter option which side to start from. Careful not to hit the hostages. Reload as necessary per IDPA requirements.

**STAGE #6: OVER OR AROUND THE HILL**

**SCENARIO:** You are again out on location preparing to do another "T" bear and "B" rabbit film. You have enlisted the aid of a couple of local Forest Rangers to scout out the area for animals and bad guys. Unfortunately the bad guys get the Rangers first. You hear shouts from behind you

and also from behind a hill. Fearing for the safety of "T" bear and "B" rabbit you react to save them and the rangers. Unbeknown to you your two film stars were captured by a group of 'tweakers' and taken to the mountains near the EDR&GC retreat.

**START:** At audible sound, turn, draw and engage bad guys in tactical priority from behind cover. Move forward to the hill and from either around or over the burm engage bad guys. If from around the hill in tactical priority, if from over the hill in tactical sequence. Reload per IDPA. All targets must be engaged from behind cover. Careful not to hit hostages.

**"TACTICAL SCENARIOS" SEPTEMBER 12 9-NOON**

Ken Greenwood announces a new format for the 2nd Sunday Pistol Shoot... "Tactical Scenarios" This will involve an opportunity for shooters of all levels (with a focus on those new to the game) to be presented with one or two scenarios the shooter will "figure out" the best way to handle it. There will be no timer as the scenario will vary with each shooter. This is a way to develop your tactical skills without a lot of gear and time. This will be a cold range and all shooting will be from a low-ready position unless you can demonstrate safe proficiency from a holster. Bring an extra magazine/speed loader and 50-100 rounds.
